To date CCMW are working out how to navigate this partnership with their diverse membership that includes Palestinians. This points out where the work comes in. It is easy to celebrate similarities. WHY DOES AGEISM REMAIN AN ACCEPTABLE FORM OF DISCRIMINATION? AND WHAT WE CAN DO ABOUT IT.

Dr. Sinha poses this question to help explore what AGEism is and why it remains an active issue that negatively impacts the lives of individuals seeking medical care each day. Through better understanding it and its negative impacts, we can all learn how to combat it at the individual, organizational and policy-making levels to help ensure Canada becomes the best place to age.

He is the Director of Geriatrics at Sinai Health System and the University Health Network in Toronto and a Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto and the Director of Health Policy Research at Toronto Metropolitan University's National Institute on Ageing.

SIMCOE COUNTY UPDATE

Simcoe County participated in **International Mitzvah Day** by partnering with Fill a Purse for A Sister Campaign. It was very successful, and we have committed to doing it again for IMD 2023.

In January, we furnished a suite for an arriving Ukrainian family. Our members donated furniture, linens, toiletries, did some home baking and donated money so we could stock the fridge. A member of Simcoe County section has set up an ESL tutoring schedule for the family. It was a perfect project as it gave several different options for participation.

In November we started a monthly lunch/coffee meetup. Starting with 5 participants in November, in March we had 17 women! This has proven to be a great way to introduce women to NCJWC, Simcoe County with no obligation. It has so far translated into 3 new members. We hold these lunches the last Wednesday of the month, so members know well in advance.

Our **Book Club** is held the first Monday of the month and will continue to be virtual as we have members that otherwise would need to travel quite a distance to attend.

Following on the success of our monthly lunch & book club, we are going to trial a monthly drop in mahj & canasta afternoon.

At the end of April, we have a **Gallery Tour** and artist talk in Midland. Midland is an hour north of Barrie/Innisfil where most of our members reside. Our hope is to organize events in other parts of Simcoe County where we have members. We have two speaker events booked for May and June that we are going to open to the community.

In July, we will repeat our Mahj/Canasta Day, this time as a fundraiser.

We are grateful to Linda Steinberg for her leadership and to her committees that continue to develop such excellent programming that make being part of NCJWC so worthwhile.
