MESSAGE from Linda Steinberg, President

We are truly shaping the next chapter for NCJWC.

Mazel Tov to Monika Simon and the 20 members of the newly recreated Montreal Section. We are so excited and look forward to working with you on Council initiatives and introducing you to our awesome organization.

Through a collaboration of 21 NCJWC leaders we are moving our Strategic Plan forward. Sheila Neuberger, Toronto President; Jordana Corenblum, Vancouver President and Debbie Wasserman, National Past President are each leading an Implementation Focus Group. Their discussions bring excitement, reflection and endless possibilities for a stronger, more cohesive and vibrant National organization. Areas being discussed are: improving efficiency, enhancing communication, leadership development, membership recruitment, outreach, expansion and fundraising. We will share our next steps with you in the fall.

Meanwhile, our National committees are developing inspirational educational programs and webinars, which support the **pillars** of our Board's Agenda and contribute to the work of our 6 Sections

The **Antisemitism Committee** has planned a series of webinars on 'Women on the Front Lines' which will culminate in an event at our AGM in November.

The work of the 'Women 2 Women (W2W) Committee Against Racism' is on hold following October 7th. Many rallies are being held throughout the country in response to the escalating incidents of Antisemitism. NCJWC members joined Toronto Section at the 'Canadian Women Against Antisemitism' rally on March 24 at Queen's Park. The speakers included Melissa Lantsman, MP, Deborah Lyons, Special Envoy on Holocaust Remembrance and Antisemitism and 2 university students who spoke about their horrific antisemitic experiences on campus which resulted in these women stepping away from their studies. This well-organized rally is a testament to the determination of women to fight hatred. Our presence was featured on local news.

Dr. Allison Sekuler, who is internationally recognized for her research will present 'Defy Dementia' on June 5th, the second webinar planned by the **Ageism Committee** .

Responding to **ALUMA's** unprecedented need for more trauma therapy counsellors following October 7th, our Sections raised \$18,707 in an emergency campaign. An additional \$5000 was donated to the Yoseftal Hospital in Eilat for the creation of a children's computer centre to acknowledge Israel's 75th anniversary. This centre has become even more important with the recent displacement of so many Israelis.

Plans are underway for National's AGM (November 2-4) and the International Council of Jewish Women's Conference and Executive meeting (November 4-6) in Toronto. All NCJWC members are invited to attend and will have an opportunity to mingle during events which overlap.

The ICJW provides an important platform to discuss global issues effecting women and humanity.

A recent zoom meeting with the Presidents of the affiliate organizations was both inspiring and heartbreaking as I learned more about the plight of women living in poverty in South Africa and the assistance that our affiliate organization provides on a regular basis.

Debbie Wasserman and myself attended the ICJW conference in Panama last fall and Debbie will attend the conference in Slovakia this May. I am looking forward to visiting our NCJWC's Sections in the fall.

NCJWC has a rich history of serving our communities and our National Board and Sections ensure that we continue to carry this torch. Yashar Koach to all.

EDMONTON UPDATE

For a small community, Edmonton Section has stayed active and will continue to stay active as you will read in the following report.

During the third week of October, the Edmonton Section implemented an early Mitzvah Day Community Project by helping the Bissell Centre in downtown Edmonton with socks and other vital items to help the homeless and people in need with winter wear. A light lunch was provided by volunteers on October 22, 2023. This community program helped over 250 people who required assistance.

Jewish Family Services depends on the Edmonton Section of NCJWC with funds to help the SMART (Seniors Making Age Related Transitions) Program continue to be provided in the community. A cheque presentation was made to JFS in November, 2023. This is greatly appreciated by all those in the community who receive help, including counselling and other related services.



On January 29th, the Edmonton Section sponsored an event called Pro-Semitism featuring Caroline D'Amore – a social media and business sensation. Although not Jewish, Caroline speaks out bravely again antisemitism and she discussed how she stands with Israel at this difficult time. This event was organized by Jewish National Fund of Canada, and NCJWC was proud to be a part of this interesting and important event.

On Sunday, March 3rd, the Aviv Israeli Folk Dance Association celebrated 18 yeas in the Edmonton Community. A large dance festival was held, and NCJWC – Edmonton Section was a proud sponsor of this fun event.

In the spring, the Edmonton Section will be supporting the Edmonton Jewish Film Festival, which is an important event for the Jewish and general community of Edmonton.

NCJWC – Edmonton Section has enjoyed working with the National Board, and we look forward to implementing the recommendations and goals from the National Strategic Planning Process.

SIMCOE COUNTY UPDATE

Simcoe County is continuing its two regular monthly programs. The first is a Book Club, meeting virtually on the first Monday of the month. The second is a drop-in in lunch, held at a local restaurant either the last Wednesday or Thursday of the month. For the months of June, July, and August, we hope to host a brown bag lunch at members' homes, with the host providing beverages and desserts.

These lunches prove to be a great way to introduce potential members to Council.

On the last Monday in July we will be holding our third annual Mahj/Canasta Day. It has grown from 8 to 14 tables last year. We can accommodate a maximum of 20 tables. We will be contributing a portion of the money raised to a National Initiative, specifics to be determined a later date.

Unfortunately, last year Mitzvah Day, which is held in November, was not as successful as prior years, likely due to the situation in Israel. We will be investigating other options for this year. In the early weeks following October 7th, Simcoe County section teamed up with Am Shalom Congregation and PJ Library to collect essential medical supplies to be sent to Israel through UJA Genesis. Our social action committee has been knitting hats for the Israeli soldiers.

The PJ Library connector for Simcoe County, Allison Sullovey Charland has joined our executive committee with the goal of engaging younger women. She has had some success and continues to work hard. An event for Purim, which was held at the Holly Public Library on Essa Road, was a huge success.

Allison has suggested a program called "Adopt a Family" for Passover. She is asking any families to put a few more chairs at their tables, to host an area family who would otherwise be alone for Seder. In January we gathered in person at Am Shalom to view a heart wrenching presentation by Shye Weinstein,

a photographer who grew up in Simcoe County, but now lives in Israel, of his experience photographing, escaping and surviving the Hamas massacre at the Supernova Music Festival on October 7th.

In mid-May we will be hosting a restorative yoga/meditation evening led by our member Cheryl Sylvester. The theme will be 'restoring resilience' and will be held in person followed by tea & cookies for those that wish to socialize.

Our member, Michaele-Sue Goldblatt continues to send out cards for life cycle events. Members are welcome to contact her directly to have a card sent.

Once again, we are grateful to Linda Steinberg for her leadership and to her committees that continue to develop such excellent programming that make being part of NCJWC so worthwhile.

L'CHAIM CANCER SUPPORT

The Great Pink Challah Bake hosted by Rabbi and Rebbitzen Plotkin of Chabad Green Lane raised \$1800 for the NCJWC Toronto L' Chaim Cancer Support Program.

A new focus on the needs and interests of young women diagnosed with cancer is underway. A program is being planned for late spring 2024, focusing on Planning a Family in the Face of Cancer, featuring a panel of leading medical experts in this field. A follow-up program, centered on adoption, surrogacy, finding spiritual meaning, and addressing mental health, is also in the works. We are excited to expand our reach and engage new audiences in our vital work of supporting Jewish women with cancer.

ONE VOICE

After many years of devoted work on this project, the remarkable group of multi-faith women, the One Voice members, have completed their comprehensive toolkit. In the coming weeks, it will be printed and mailed to all faith leaders in the GTA. This will coincide with a virtual event to launch the publication, featuring faith leaders, professionals in the field of domestic violence, and survivors.



VANCOUVER UPDATE

Vancouver, which was established in 1924, has had a couple of really big events in the last several months as we step into our 100th year.

Our Games Day for Israel was a huge success. We had 120 people gather for a fun filled afternoon - everyone has such a great time. AND we were able to send \$8000 from our section to support Aluma! We also had a stellar event in Honor of International Women's Day. On Monday March 25th, NCJWC Vancouver proudly welcomed over 140 people to the first ever live recording of the BEYOND A BALLOT podcast. We are so thrilled that we had the opportunity to partner with this incredible company on this event. We value the importance of women not only having the right to vote (which was not established federally in Canada until 1920!) but also, exercising that right in an informed way.

We are really excited about our upcoming food security programs that will be starting in May. We are collaborating with Jewish Family Services and our Jewish community garden to bring farm to table interactive educational programming to families in our community.
